Despite the torrential rain and wind prior to the competition, over 90 students from Jack Hunt represented the school to complete the gruelling course for the 2007 Peterborough Schools Cross-Country Championships at Bretton Park. The students showed a great deal of determination to complete the courses ranging from 2.3km to 5km. The Junior boys had a fantastic performance with three students from Year 8 finishing in the top ten, even though they were competing against Year 9 boys. Jack Moore (8DN) finished 3rd, Ross Huskisson (8BD) finished 8th and Callum Reid (8BD) finished 10th. All three students have now been selected to represent Peterborough Schools at the Cambridgeshire Cross Country Championships at St Neots in January.

There was also an excellent performance from Emily Cook (11GE) who finished 4th in the Inter Girls competition. Sarah Caskey (13KR) outstandingly finished 1st in the Senior Girls and Chris Clarke (12GM) finished 2nd in the Senior Boys competition. Again, these three students will represent Peterborough Schools at the Cambridgeshire Cross-Country Championships.

Our **Sports Leaders courses** continue to grow and with it the opportunities open to our young people for volunteering are developing. Sports Leaders Courses are accredited Awards that students can study within their core PE lessons. They give students the skills to be able to coach young children in a variety of circumstances and environments. The courses are extremely enjoyable and rewarding for students. For example our current Year 10 students are learning to deliver basic skills sessions to Year 5 children from Thorpe Primary School. Our Sports Leaders

will plan and lead an entire fitness session for students. In addition Year 10 students are also leading lunchtime badminton sessions for Year 7, 8 and 9 students. During the last half term both our year 10 Sports Leaders and our year 12 Community Sports Leaders have been involved with many activities within our family of Primary schools. Year 12 have run a Football Festival in which 10 teams entered and a Kingball Festival for Years 3 and 4. Our year 10 Sports Leaders have run Fitness sessions for Thorpe and Hoop Ball fun sessions. In all approximately 300 Primary School pupils have been involved in these activities.



Sports Leaders Lead Student Voice for Physical Education

Erin Symns and Aimi Elkins have been running the PE Student Voice meetings for years 7, 8 and 9. There has been some lively discussion and many good ideas for activities and general improvements for students experience in PE.

Sports Coaching: We now have a number of after school PE clubs run by local sports coaches. Examples of these would be Peterborough Lions Rugby Club, Peterborough City Rowing Club and Peterborough Town Cricket Club. The aim of these sessions is to enhance the sporting programme we are able to offer students, but to also create a link with a club so students may find the transition to club sport a little bit easier. In addition to this we have also started a Badminton coaching programme which is led by Billy Chen. Billy is a former Asian doubles champion and his coaching has led to a considerable improvement in the standard of play of our students.
