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## **1. Our Commitment**

- 1.1 Jack Hunt School is committed to supporting, using and promoting Fairtrade, wherever possible. We believe that Fairtrade can make a difference to the lives of young people throughout the world by improving living and working conditions for the people who grow the things we buy.

## **2. Aim**

- 2.2 In particular Jack Hunt School will:

- (a) Promote Fairtrade in the school and wider community, by taking part in Fairtrade Fortnight, completing Fairtrade Challenges and highlighting Fairtrade activities in our newsletters/website
- (b) Ensure that Fairtrade and Fairtrade issues, and the concept of 'fairness', are embedded into the curriculum and in whole school activities, and the culture of the school.
- (c) Use the Fairtrade Schools Award identities where allowed on the School's website and letterheads.
- (d) Use Fairtrade products wherever possible:
  - (i) Tea, coffee, sugar and snacks in the staffroom and at meetings.
  - (ii) In cookery activities.
  - (iii) In the school canteen.
- (e) Put this Policy into practice through a Fairtrade Group that meets regularly to:
  - (i) Monitor and drive forward the school's support for Fairtrade.
  - (ii) Make sure those connected with our school are aware of this Policy and can support it.
  - (iii) Take responsibility for Fairtrade Challenges & the Fairtrade Action Plan.
