

Sporting Success for Swimmers




Katie Brown (Year 9) qualified for 6 individual events and 3 relays in her age group nationals this year. In her individual events she reached four finals. Her best event is 200m fly and she finished in 5th place in a time of 2.21 which was a big personal best (PB) and a time that would have won her a gold in previous years. It was also an international qualifying time. In her 100m fly and 200m freestyle she finished in 7th place and in 400m freestyle she finished 10th. She

performed PBs in all of these events and was in 7th place in the BAGCAT points for her age group in GB.

Dan Brown (Year 11) qualified for 2 individual and 2 relay events at the Youth Nationals this year. He is in a double age group category - 15/16. His best event is 200m fly in

which he got to the semi finals and then the finals with an impressive PB finishing in 10th position overall and missing an international time by a fraction of a second although he now has another year to achieve the same times. He also did a 3 second PB in the 400m individual medley.



Liam also competed in the Robin Hood Open Meet at Ponds Forge, Sheffield in October, and managed to go under 30 seconds for the 50m freestyle for the first time with a time of 29.98 seconds.

All three of these swimmers have also recently clocked the necessary times to be eligible for the 2014 Commonwealth Games trials. Many congratulations and good luck.

We now have a sports college reward scheme for all students who represent the school on a sporting fixture from the start of this term. On the first
