


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Swimming Success

Congratulations to Year 8 student, Katie Brown, who knocked two seconds off her personal best in the Freestyle and is now ranked second in the UK in her age group for the 200m Freestyle after competing in the British Gas International Open Meet in Leeds recently.

Katie swims for the City of Peterborough Swimming Club and also for Cambridgeshire. She has been swimming competitively since she was eight years old and now trains seven times each week.

She competed at the East Region Championships in Norwich in 2012 and won Gold Medals in the 100m and 200m Fly, the 200m and 400m Freestyle and the 200m and 400m Individual Medley (IM). She also won a Silver Medal in the 100m Freestyle and a Bronze in the 200m Backstroke. She was awarded the BAGCAT Award for being the top 12 year old girl in the region.

The National Age Group Championships are held at Ponds Forge, Sheffield, in July each year and in the last two years Katie has qualified for a number of events. In 2011 she won a National Silver Medal in the 200m Fly and reached the finals in the 100m Fly and 200m IM. In 2012 she won the Silver Medal in the 200m Fly again, and reached the finals in the 100m Fly, 200m IM and 400m IM. She was placed 7th overall for her age group in the whole of the UK and Ireland.

This year she has been selected to take part in a Talent Development Programme run by the English ASA and has also been nominated for Junior Sportswoman of the Year by the Peterborough Telegraph for the past two years.

Future Paralympic Hopes

Congratulations to Year 11 student, Ben Knighton who was recently selected from 22 people to attend an England Cerebral Palsy "CP" Development Squad Training Weekend.

This is an event organised by the FA CP Centre of Excellence Programme, part of the FA Disability Talent Pathway Programme. Regional centres recruit an Under 16 squad to complement the existing adult squad which provides a direct route for players into the England CP Development Squad.

This was a fantastic opportunity for Ben to train under the watchful eye and guidance from National coaches. Each training session was held at St Georges Park, Burton-on-Trent.

Ben has and continues to work very hard to develop his level of performance. He currently has a detailed training programme that focusses on many areas, including, football training sessions, diet, nutrition and fitness training.

Ben is waiting to find out if he will be selected to play in a Home Nations Tournament in May and hopes to be invited back to St George's Park to be tested on future training programmes which will make sure he can cope with the fitness and pressure of competing in these types of events.

In the future he hopes to progress to be able to play for the Senior Team which will hopefully give him his ultimate dream of being selected for the 2016 or 2020 Paralympic Games.

This is a fantastic achievement, well done and good luck for the future.
